CRETE CHURCH PROFILE 2017

Crete Church is a **welcoming** body of believers following Christ as our head, adhering to the Bible as our only source of truth, and seeking Him and His will in prayer. We are a member of the Presbyterian Church of America, a session led church adhering to the PCA Book of Church Order. We are blessed to have dedicated ministry leaders and a fully engaged staff. We are welcoming to all, and demonstrate our outreach commitment by involvement in our community including sponsoring Vacation Bible School, GEMS Girls' Club, Cadets Boys' Club, The Edge Community Coffee House, and host to the Crete Bulldogs Football League. Our worship glorifies God in a broadly blended format that includes both "traditional" and "contemporary" elements, with all ages participating. Our congregation is fun, friendly, caring and supportive. We are a congregation of approximately 105 families with about 150 gathering together for Sunday Worship and a budget around \$400,000.

OUR HISTORY

Crete Church was originally established as Crete Reformed Church in the mid-1960's by some families in the Crete-Beecher area. They were eager to plant a church with Reformed/ Presbyterian beliefs since there were no other churches in this region of this persuasion at the time.

The church eventually began meeting in the Crete-Monee schools and built its first church home between the Old Plank Trail Bank and the High School on Exchange Street. The church continued to grow until they exceeded the building's capacity in the late 1980's.

The church leaders had a vision to replant and expand the church and reach more people with the good news of Jesus. This vision became a reality in the early 1990's when land was obtained across from Walt's Foods and the original building was sold. On the new site near Illinois Route 394, construction began on a much larger facility. During the two-year construction period, Crete Church occupied space in Village Woods, a retirement center a few miles south of our current location.

In 2015 Crete Church along with five other Reformed Church of America churches in the area left the RCA and became members of the PCA, Presbyterian Church of America.

We believe the Church is not a building, it is the people who belong to it. We are blessed to have a growing diversity of people from all walks of life. We are growing together and reaching out to others who need the love and life Jesus Christ offers.

Our church was organized in 1967, Pastor Robert D. Eggebeen served Crete Church from 1965 to 1968, and was succeeded by Pastor Ronald L. Sikkema who served from 1969 to 1972. Pastor Walter H. Pickup served from 1974 to 1984, and Pastor Mark Prestriedge led us from 1985 to 2009. Our most recent pastor, David Smith led our congregation from 2010 until June of 2017. Pastor Smith passed in July 2017.

CHURCH BUILDING AND PROPERTY INFORMATION

Crete Church owns the property located at 24755 S. Country Lane, Crete, Illinois, with no outstanding debt. The property consists of approximately 12 acres improved with a one level building that was originally completed in 1994, and a classroom addition completed in 2003. The building is 33,500 square feet. Additionally we have an approximate 1500 square foot woodworking shop and garage. A pavilion is currently being built for joint use by our church and the Crete Bulldogs. The buildings and paved parking area sit on approximately 6 acres.

The air conditioned church building will comfortably seat about 400 on the main floor, with additional seating for 80 in the balcony. There is a Family Life Center immediately adjacent to the sanctuary/narthex, which creates an easy flow for the congregation to gather after worship service. The FLC is equipped with a full kitchen and a portable sound system. The floor is carpeted with court lines for basketball and volleyball.

The building also has six private offices for staff, a library, two nurseries, prayer room, 16 classrooms, a youth room with small kitchen, projection and sound system, a gathering room (called Fireside room) which is also equipped with a small kitchen and sound system.

• SHINING STARS CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES and ORGANIZATIONS •

• **CHILDREN'S ORGANIZATIONS** •

GEMS Girls' Club - A mentoring ministry designed to bring girls, 2nd through 12th grade, into a living relationship with Jesus Christ, through relationships, praise, devotions and badge work. This girls club is open to the community and meets the first and third Wednesdays of the month, September through May.

Cadets Boys' Club - A ministry to bring boys, 2nd through 12th grade, into a living relationship with Jesus Christ. Cadets are designed for Christian men who are trained in the word, to help boys grow spiritually in their devotional, mental, physical and social life. Cadets meet the first and third Wednesdays of the month, September through May.

• **JR. AND SR. HIGH SCHOOL MINISTRIES** •

Jr. High Ministries (6th - 8th grade) - Jr. High ministry consists of Sunday Morning Sunday School and bi-monthly Wednesday evening meetings/activities. Our youth group meetings consist of Bible study, social activities, retreats, and one on one mentoring. We are committed to loving our youth and caring for their spiritual and physical well-being.

Sr. High Ministries (9th - 12th grade) - Sr. High ministry consists of Sunday morning High School Catechism Class and Sunday evening meetings/activities. Our youth group meetings consist of Bible Study, socials activities, service projects, one on one mentoring and leadership training. We are committed to loving our youth and caring for their spiritual and physical well-being.

SPAM (Sr. High Performing Arts Ministry) - SPAM meets on Sunday mornings with high school and adults working together in creating skits that brings Biblical truths and stories to life.

COOPERATIVE OUTREACH MINISTRIES

• THE EDGE COFFEE HOUSE MINISTRY •

In 2009 God placed on our hearts the idea of a Community Coffee House and we asked the other churches in the community to come on board with the idea. The United Methodist Church joined us with the vision of the Coffee House, along with representatives from the Lutheran Church as workers. The current board is made up of representatives for the Coffee House Ministry from Crete Church, United Methodist Church, Local Business and School Board. The Edge Community Coffee House opened on August 29th 2009. The ministry continues to reach many in our community with the Love of Jesus Christ.

With the development of the coffee house, doors were opened for us to come along side the community for Crete Country Christmas with two of our members leading the committee. Our church allows the use of our facility to house the Kris Kringle Market, providing a food venue to the vendors and Christmas shoppers. We also provide a trolley service for the event to help families travel free from the various locations in the community.

• FAITH AND ACTION •

Our church members provide assistance to Faith and Action, a local ministry that supplies needs to under resourced families, children, and churches on the south side of Chicago and surrounding areas. We help by hosting a “Summerfest” event for the families and community, plus volunteer in various programs such as gardening, fishing and pumpkin patch days. From homework help, to music lessons, to coat giveaways, our members are working to assist “Faith and Action”.

• CHRIST CARES •

Crete Church walks alongside Christ Cares Ministries from Chicago Heights. Once a month we host 10-20 homeless people that are part of Christ Cares ministries. We provide a day of “Sabbath Rest” by opening our doors early on the first Tuesday of the month, providing cots to rest on, a washer and dryer to allow the guests to wash their clothes, and Bible study for spiritual development. A group luncheon allows our staff and other members of our church to visit and build relationships with our guests for the day. This ministry operates October - April.

We also work alongside Christ Cares Ministries, by collecting toys at Christmas time for children in our area. Not only do we collect the toys, our whole congregation comes together the Sunday before Christmas to wrap and organize the toys that are collected from various other churches. Our youth and adults participate in this activity to help Christ Cares bring the message of Christmas to many homes and shelters.

Crete Church works with Weight Watchers to provide a friendly meeting place for those in our community who are seeking to live a healthier life style.

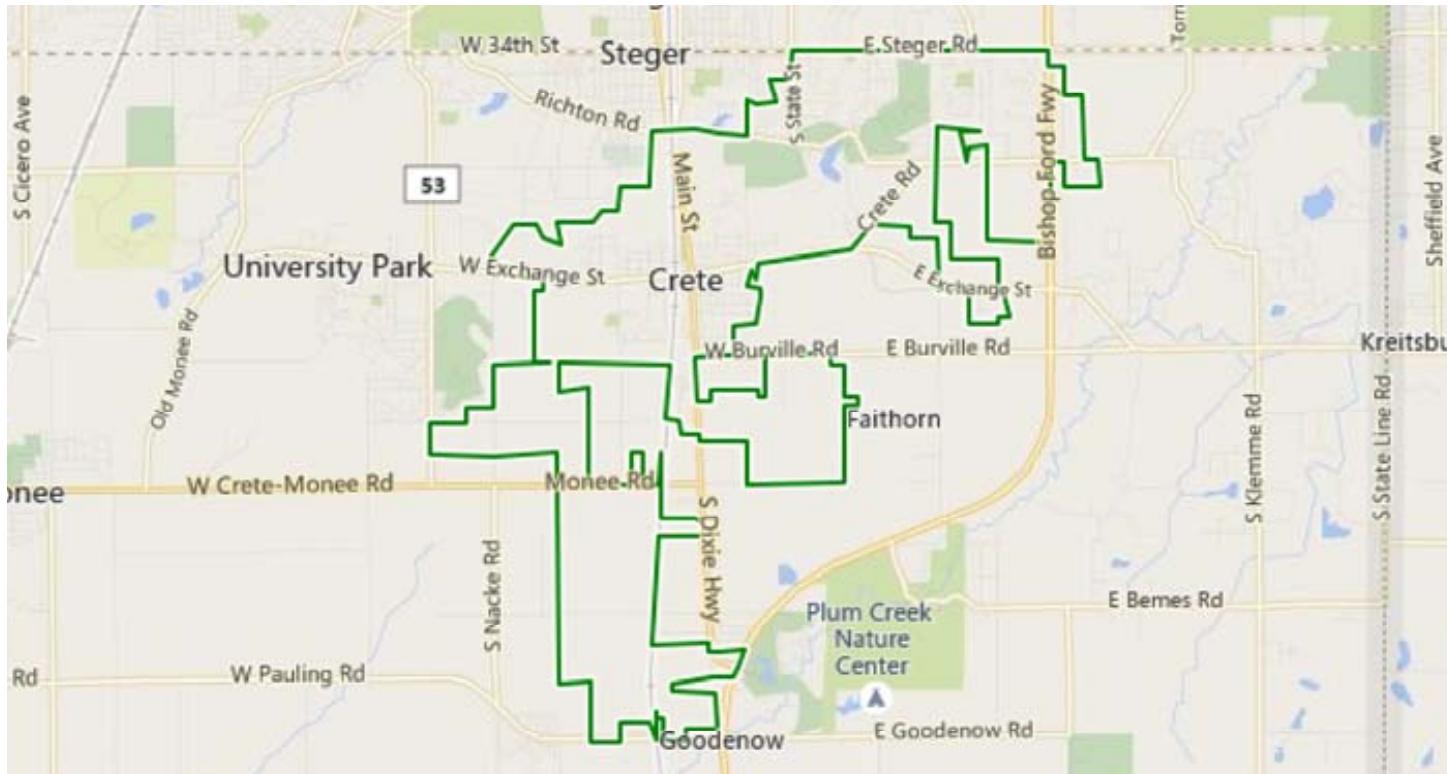
• HOLLAND COMPANY •

Crete is a community unique to the Chicago metropolitan area. Located just 30 miles south of the Loop in Will County, it has maintained its small town charm. Dyer/St. John located 24 miles southeast of Chicago, is a well planned community, filled with quiet neighborhoods and quality schools. It has over 20 parks and an active park program for the residents.
