Ministry</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pursue personal growth, theological understanding, and ministry assessment; meet with Youth staff weekly for discipleship, training, and support; meet with Ministry Leader every month for personal growth, ministry assessment, and encouragement; complete all assignments and fulfill assigned responsibilities • Participate in Student Ministry Team development; recruit and oversee lay leaders; assist in training and developing the team; meet with one or more your volunteers weekly for discipleship, training, and support; meet with Student Ministry Team weekly • Participate in the planning, leading, and evaluation of assigned student ministry events including Sunday school, small groups, special events, camps, conferences, retreats, mission trips, etc. • Participate in intentional relational ministry (contact work) with students; spend time with students outside Youth Ministry programs and events; visit students on their own turf (i.e., school, sporting events, home, etc.); take students on road trips, camping, or other informal events; pursue lost students as well as those who know the Lord • Assist in the development of ministry tools, programs, and events <p>B.
