In addition, we acknowledge that the 3 restricting of TE's teaching of his exception on LC 109 was procedurally out of order 4 and no longer consider it in effect.

- **Response [2018]:** Regrettably, Calvary Presbytery failed to identify the nature of the

- Rationale [2018]: While the Presbytery reported the difference, they did not judge
   the stated difference according to the prescribed categories.
- **Response [2019]:** On October 25, 2018, Calvary Presbytery voted to grant TE's [name omitted] exception on LC 109 as "more than semantic, but 'not out of accord with any fundamental of our system of doctrine," per *RAO* 16-3.3-5. Regrettably, this action should have taken place on Oct. 22, 2015 when he first filed his difference with the presbytery. We trust that this action satisfies the concerns of the RPR.
- e. That the following response be found unsatisfactory, therefore a new response
   must be submitted to the following GA:
- Exception [2018]: Apr 27, 2017 (*Preliminary Principle* 1) The resulting prohibition whereby a TE was prevented from teaching his accepted view is contrary to our practice of good faith subscription and the first preliminary principle.
- Response [2019]: In contrast to the 2017 RPR's judgment, Calvary Presbytery
   respectfully asserts its constitutional prerogative to restrict the public teaching of
   certain exceptions to the Westminster Standards for the following reasons:

## 1. The Practice is in Harmony with Preliminary Principles #1 and #2:

We would vigorously defend Preliminary Principle #1, as it affirms liberty of 29 conscience, specifically that, "the rights of private judgment in all matters that 30 respect religion are universal and inalienable." At the same time, we affirm the 31 32 "perfect consistency" with Preliminary Principle #2 which states that "every Christian Church, or union or association of particular churches, is entitled to 33 declare terms of admission into its communion and the qualifications of its 34 ministers and members, as well as the whole system of its internal government 35 which Christ has appointed." Since Calvary Presbytery is necessarily vested with 36 this power to declare terms of its admission, we acted in accord with both 37 principles. It should be especially noted that the court did not injure the liberty of 38 conscience of said TE. In accord with Preliminary Principle #1 this restriction did 39 not injure "the rights of his private judgment at all," because he was able to hold 40 his difference, teach it to his family, and answer honestly if asked about it 41 privately. We only restricted the public teaching and preaching of his view, which 42 is in accord with Preliminary Principle #2. Furthermore, as Preliminary Principle 43 44 #2 states, granting membership is a "right," and even if its terms of communion are "either too lax or narrow...it does not infringe upon the liberty or the rights 45

of others..." As TE Guy Prentiss Waters has written, church office "is a privilege (not a right) that the court grants to those whom it deems qualified." Calvary Presbytery merely exercised this right in harmony with both preliminary principles.

## 2. This Practice is in Harmony with PCA Polity

In the history of our own presbytery, we have occasionally restricted a man's teaching concerning exceptions. Our Stated Clerk, TE Roy Taylor, in response to our inquiry on the question of PCA Polity & practice of restricting the teaching of certain views, said that "this issue was debated while hammering out the terms of Good Faith Subscription." He asserts that it "has never been resolved," and that "we have lived with differences of procedure among Presbyteries." While there are several constitutional procedures concerning our method of subscription and the handling of examples (*BCO* 13-6, 13-7, 19-2.f, 21-4.b,e,f and *RAO* 16-3.e.5), yet none of these rules prohibit Presbytery from restricting a man from publicly teaching an exception. Furthermore, Calvary Presbytery in its consultation with other PCA Presbyteries concerning their practice of "Restricting the Teaching of Certain Views" has concluded that our view is not unique or isolated with the history and practice of PCA Polity. Therefore, Calvary Presbytery acted in harmony with polity within the PCA.

## 3. The Practice is in Harmony with Historic Rulings of the SJC

As TE Guy Prentiss Waters demonstrates\*, "not fewer than three Assemblies upheld the right of Presbytery to forbid a member from teaching his exception." In 1992, the SJC upheld the action of James River Presbytery, by stating: "Presbyteries may exercise such power over the preaching and teaching of its members short of a determination that the forbidden teaching is heresy, without necessarily binding the consciences of the men under its care. . . . We must defer to presbytery, therefore, as the court most able to determine what may be harmful to the spiritual welfare of the churches under its care." The SJC also upholds the right of the court to restrict teaching six years earlier, at the 14<sup>th</sup> GA: "When a man is ordained with the allowance of exceptions to his full acceptance of the PCA standards, he thereby obtains (1) approval of his suitability to function within the ordained office, and (2) liberty to believe and live in some way not fully in accord with some portion of those standards. This allowance, however, does not warrant his teaching or preaching of that matter so as to disturb the peace and purity of the church." Finally, in 1990, the SJC also affirmed the right of presbyteries to restrict teaching of exceptions: "Presbyteries do have jurisdiction over TEs and have the authority to restrict a minister from preaching views which the presbytery is convinced may be harmful to the spiritual welfare of churches under its care (BCO 13-9 and 34-5)." Therefore, Calvary Presbytery acted in harmony with historic rulings of the SJC.

In closing, again we respectfully disagree with the RPR's judgment of an exception of substance concerning the restricting of a minister at our April 27, 2017 meeting. As we have demonstrated, this practice is not in opposition to "Good Faith Subscription," but is in harmony with PCA polity. It is also not opposed to the 1<sup>st</sup> Preliminary Principle, but upholds liberty of conscience while

3			substance be removed and that our minutes be approved.

- **Response** [2019]: It was Iliana's understanding that TE [name omitted] had obtained 15 concurrence of his presbytery at the time. This was also Iliana's understanding of the 16 reading of (BCO 13-2). The presbytery now recognizes the error of this oversight of 17 not documenting it properly and will endeavor to document this more diligently in the 18 19 future. If the revitalization work had been successful Illiana would have taken steps as soon as possible to correct this inaction and followed BCO 13-2 direction. By God's 20 providence this TE's ministry in Illiana ended soon after these actions and this 21 particular work closed not long after this TE returned to his home presbytery 22
- Exception: Jan 21, 2017 p. 2 lines 97-99 (BCO 21-4) Stated differences are not in
   candidate's own words.
- Exception: Jan 21, 2017 (BCO 21-4) Stated differences not judged with prescribed categories
- **Response [2019]:** Illiana recognizes the error and will strive to accurately and fully document identified differences in the future. The presbytery found that TE's [name omitted] stated differences, included here in his own words, were not exceptions as his view on recreation on the Sabbath is commonly held, his view on creation conforms to the analogical day position accepted by the PCA General Assembly, and neither of these views were found to be hostile to the system nor striking at the vitals of religion.
  - The only exception I take to the Standards is in WCF 21.8 regarding the prohibition on "recreations," also found in WLC 117 and WSC 60 and 61. My rationale for this is twofold.
  - First, to the best of my knowledge, the only proof text that addresses this directly is Isa 58:13, which speaks of "going your own ways, or seeking your own pleasure" on the Sabbath. While at first blush this appears to prohibit recreation, in my opinion, Isa 58:3 helps to interpret what the prophet means by "pleasure": "Behold, in the day of your fast you seek your own pleasure, and oppress all your workers." In other words, "pleasure" here refers not to common and lawful recreations, but injustice.
  - Second, the consistent and repeated Sabbath prohibitions throughout Scripture are related to work and commercial activity (e.g., Ex 20:10; Jer

17:19ff.; Neh 13). Therefore, I believe this is the thrust of what we are resting from, in order that we may worship the Triune God on the Lord's Day. In short, so long as we prioritize public and private worship, as well as acts of necessity and mercy, on the Lord's Day -- which will necessarily consume the majority of the day -- I do not believe it is sinful to engage in limited amounts of non-commercial recreation.

I hold to an analogical view of the creation days. In short, this means that I see the thrust of the creation account being God's pattern-setting for His creation -- six days of work, plus one day of rest (Ex 20:9-11). There is a certain similarity between man being made in God's image, and man's days being made in the likeness of God's days. And just as God went out to work and then rest, so do we -- in a similar way, but not in an identical way. Regarding the length of the days, I am persuaded by the analogical view's appreciation for their unspecified length. After all, the Hebrew "yom" can take on many meanings and does not force a 24-hour view. Likewise, other passages speak to the mystery of how God relates to time (e.g., Job 10:5; Ps 90:4; 2 Pet 3:8).

In terms of my understanding of the Confession's use of the clause "in the 18 19 space of six days," I see this primarily as a reaction against an instantaneous creation view (e.g., Augustine). While the private writings of several divines 20 indicate they held to ordinary days, their omission of 24-hour language calls 21 into question whether they intended to bind men on this point, especially 22 within a consensus document. Moreover, the fact that there is but one allusion 23 to the length of the days suggests that this topic was not of first importance, 24 as creation ex nihilo and Adam's federal headship were. 25

Since that time, the Senior Pastor at that time has been contacted and he is aware of 41 conversations with this particular church and is willing to affirm that they do indeed 42 maintain the Word and Sacrament in their fundamental integrity and that this 43 particular TE was released to a new ministry that is faithful to the scriptures. 44

The candidate's differences in his own words, which were approved as more than semantic but not out of accord with any fundamental of the system of doctrine, will be recorded in the minutes and were as follows.
- WCF-Ch 21.8. Recreation on the Sabbath: I hold to the WCF view of the 38 Sabbath as a whole, but the scriptural proofs the confession uses aren't 39 40 precise when it comes to recreation. I believe that Christ teaches plainly that it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath (Mt. 12:12). Primarily this is 41 about works of necessity, but I believe this can also apply to family time 42 or other similar godly endeavors such as recreational time with friends. I 43 don't believe it is sinful to toss a ball in the back yard with your family, 44 or to go on a walk with your wife on the Sabbath, or something similar. 45

Loving people well is a high calling, and is permitted to do on the Sabbath, and I do not consider that to be a form of work. However, I would not encourage families or persons to abandon worship to attend sporting events, neglect worship for travel sports, or anything similar. Isaiah 58:18 indicates "pleasure" as breaking of Sabbath commands, but that pleasure in context regards conducting business activities, not recreation.

- LC 109. With respect to images, I do not believe it is a violation of the 7 2nd Commandment to use images depicting Jesus' humanity. The Bible 8 is clear in its instruction not to create an idol to worship; I do not believe 9 that the text prohibits the use of images for pedagogical uses. We should 10 be careful that we distinguish teaching versus worship. The two are not 11 equal. It is possible to use teaching aids, and they not be worshiped in 12 place of the Lord, one example being teaching aids for children in Sunday 13 School. Additionally, I agree with David VanDrumnen's conclusion 14 concerning the intent of the Westminster divines that, "If indeed the 15 Westminster divines were of a mind to omit pictures of Christ's humanity 16 from the proscriptions in Larger Catechism 109, they would surely have 17 needed to have stated this explicitly" (David VanDrunen, "Pictures of 18 19 Jesus and the Sovereignty of Divine Revelation: Recent literature and a Defense of the Confessional Reformed View," The Confessional 20 Presbyterian 5 [2009] 214-227). Because of these noted reasons, I believe 21 that the use of depictions of the humanity of Jesus for teaching purposes 22 is allowed. If these images as used, then it should be stated that the images 23 are only for teaching and not an accurate portrayal of Jesus for worship. 24

- WCF 21-8: This section, along with WSC 60 and WLC 117, forbids acts 38 of recreation on the Sabbath day. I take exception to this statement because 39 40 I believe it is contrary to what the Bible teaches. Jesus says that the Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. Ex. 23:12 states that 41 the Sabbath is both for rest and refreshment – spiritually and physically. 42 Finally, the WLC 121 helps us understand that one way to practice 43 44 "remembrance" on the Sabbath is through thankful remembrance of creation. Thus, since the Sabbath was made for humans, in part for their 45

1		physical refreshment, and for thankful remembrance of creation, I believe
2		non-organized recreation, such as hiking or biking, is a practical way to
3		observe the Sabbath. This is because recreation can be very refreshing for
4		most humans and is a way to enjoy God's creation.
5		WLC 109: Since Christ is the "image of the invisible God" (Col 1:15),
6		and the "exact imprint of his nature" (Heb 1:3), one cannot help but picture
7		Christ inwardly when reading the Gospels or taking the Lord's supper.
8		Thus, I take exception to the statement that we cannot make any
9		representations of God inwardly, as the Confession states. Furthermore,
10		while I affirm that we cannot make any representations of God for the
11		purpose of worship, I believe we can use images of the humanity of Christ
12		for educational purposes – but not for worship.
13		WLC 151: Though on one level all sins are equally worthy of God's wrath
14		and require Christ's atoning blood, I affirm WLC 151 when it says that
15		some sins bring us more guilt and do us more damage. Thus, I affirm most
16		of WLC 151, such as when it says sins against a weaker brother are greater
17		(Rom 14:13); however, there is an aspect of WLC that I disagree with. I
18		take exception to the assertion that the day in which sin is committed (i.e.,
19		the Lord's Day) makes it worse.
20		WLC 191: While I affirm that Christians should submit themselves to
21		governing authorities (Rom 13:1), I do not believe this implies that the
22		authority of the church is under the state. I therefore take exception to the
23		idea that the church is "countenanced and maintained by the civil
24		magistrate"; I believe that Christ alone is the one who supports and
25		maintains the church (Eph. 1:22).
