3 4 5	Whereas , the sins of domestic abuse and sexual assault are expressly forbidden (2 Timothy 3:2-5; Jude 7; Exodus 21:15; Deuteronomy 22:25-27; also <i>WLC</i> 135 and 139); and
6 7 8 9	Whereas , these sins are especially heinous because they are "against the express letter of the law," "break many commandments," "admit of no reparation," and often involve various other aggravations (<i>WLC</i> 151); and
10 11 12	Whereas, these sins are grievously prevalent in our society; and
13 14 15 16	Whereas, these sins often produce in the victims a complex response of denial along with immense fear and shame that persist with varying severity throughout life (e.g., 2 Samuel 13:1-22); and
17 18 19 20 21 22	Whereas, it is the responsibility of the elders of the church to exercise their authority, severally and jointly, to shepherd those who are under their care by guarding against such sinful behavior as much as possible, by wisely caring for those victimized by the sins of others, and by appropriately disciplining those guilty of such sins toward a full repentance; and
23 24	Whereas, these sins have been a concerning subject of attention not only in other denominations but even in the proceedings of the 46th General Assembly; and
25262728	Whereas , the 42nd General Assembly previously exhorted the PCA and its courts to respond boldly against one form of these sins, namely the sexual abuse of children; and
29 30 31	Whereas, no standardized resources for pastoral care on these sins and their complex consequences exist for officers, church courts, and agencies in the PCA; and
32 33 34 35	Whereas , no clear guidelines for policy or practice with regard to these sins exist for the officers, church courts, and agencies in the PCA that would protect individuals and congregations; and
36 37	Whereas , the Rules of Discipline make no consideration for the unique heinousness of these sins and their practical effect on victims;
38 39 40	Therefore, be it resolved to hereby overture the 47th General Assembly of the PCA to form a committee to study:
41 42 43 44	(1) the nature of domestic abuse and sexual assault;(2) pastoral resources available for the care of survivors of these sins;(3) pastoral resources available on the perpetrators of these sins;

1	(4) the best practices and policy guidelines for elders, church courts, and agencies for
2	protecting against these sins and for responding to them;
3	(5) the possibility of changes to the Rules of Discipline that would appropriately
4	protect victims of these sins within a biblical process; and
5	(6) the possible need for repentance as a church; and

7	Be it further resolved that the committee shall be appointed by the moderator, and shall
8	include among its members or advisory members at least two subject-matter experts
9	and at least two women; and
10	
11	Be it further resolved that the budget for the study committee be set at \$15,000/year and that
12	funds be derived from gifts to the AC designated for that purpose; and
13	
14	Be it further resolved that the committee shall present their findings and recommendations
15	for adoption by the 48th General Assembly.
