4	Whereas, the Presbyterian Church in America was founded as a "grass-roots" denomination
5	with power and authority flowing from the bottom up; and
6	
7	Whereas, the expense of sending a commissioner to the General Assembly has become
8	prohibitive for many small churches in the PCA; and

10	Whereas, many commissioners would attend the General Assembly, yet are unable because
11	of health restrictions; and
12	
13	Whereas, the General Assembly meetings now have a small representation by ruling elders;
14	and
15	
16	Whereas, it is in accordance with the founding principles of the PCA to have parity of the
17	teaching and ruling elders in authority; and
18	
19	Whereas, it is in accordance with the founding principles of the PCA and our BCO to have
20	parity of teaching and ruling elders on General Assembly committees (BCO 14-1;
21	Principles for the Organization of the Assembly, item 10) and to have at least parity
22	of teaching and ruling elders at General Assembly court meetings (BCO 14-2); and
23	
24	Whereas, the technology exists to have commissioners vote on issues of the General
25	Assembly from a distance while they watch the proceedings of the General Assembly
26	online; and
27	
28	Whereas, the General Assembly as presently structured would continue with the exception of
29	a distance voting commissioner;
30	
31	Therefore , Westminster Presbytery overtures the 47 th General Assembly to instruct the PCA
32	Administrative Committee to investigate and report at the 48 th General Assembly a
33	plan to create a DVC (Distance Voting Commissioner) which would entail the ability
34	of regularly elected commissioners to vote electronically at a distance from the site of
35	the General Assembly.
