OVERTURE 45 from Missouri Presbytery 1 (to AC, OC) "Form an Ad Interim Committee to Seek Consensus on Doctrinal Boundaries 2 and Pastoral Care in the Current Debates About Sexuality" 3 4 Whereas there is great responsibility and opportunity, occasioned by the cultural moment, for 5 the church to be better equipped to announce and embody the gracious, dignifying 6 welcome and life-giving wisdom found in the Gospel of Jesus Christ to non-Christians 7 who live with homosexuality or experience unique manifestations of brokenness in 8 matters of gender and sexuality; and 9 10 Whereas there is significant complexity to some important aspects of the theological, 11 pastoral, terminological, and missiological issues underlying homosexuality; and 12 13 Whereas there is already significant disagreement and discord within the PCA with respect to: 14 15 16 approaches to pastoral care for Christians living with homosexuality; and the use of such terms as "sexual orientation," "gay," "sexual minorities," "gay 17 Christian" and the "identity questions" it raises, etc., and whether such use constitutes 18 profound doctrinal or perhaps practical error, and ought to be soundly condemned and 19 censured or, on the other hand, tolerated, with proper caveats and qualifications; and 20 21 22 Whereas doctrinal boundaries and pastoral applications of sensitive and/or controversial issues are best made by deliberative and collaborative debate, study, conversation, and 23 consensus-building rather than by judicial fiat in investigations and trials, a principle 24 that was demonstrated to be so helpful in the case of the Ad-Interim Committee on 25 Divorce and Remarriage (1992) and the Ad-interim Committee on the Days of 26 Creation (2000); and 27 28 Whereas the peace and purity of the church as well as the integrity of and energy for the 29 mission of the church to our secular culture is at stake in these current debates; and 30 31 Whereas our Presbytery ad hoc committee appointed to investigate Memorial PCA's hosting 32 of the 2018 Revoice conference, after giving careful consideration to the underlying 33 theological, pastoral, and missiological matters, recommended that we overture the 34 General Assembly for a further in-depth study/consensus-building committee for the 35 purpose of coming to greater doctrinal clarity in pursuit of a deeper church unity on 36 issues touching homosexuality; 37 38 **Therefore, be it resolved** that the 47th General Assembly create an Ad Interim Committee 39 (AIC) to study the topic of sexuality with particular attention to the issue of where the 40 church has failed in its ministry to same-sex-attracted men and women, and what the 41 church ought to be doing now in its ministry to them, while neither compromising the 42 gospel nor dulling the vitality of its message to lost people. 43
