4 5	Whereas, the sins of domestic abuse and sexual assault are expressly forbidden (2 Timothy
6	3:2-5; Jude 7; Exodus 21:15; Deuteronomy 22:25-27; also <i>WLC</i> 135 and 139); and
7	
8 9	Whereas, these sins are especially heinous because they are "against the express letter of the law," "break many commandments," "admit of no reparation," and often involve
10	various other aggravations (WLC 151); and
11 12	Whereas, these sins are grievously prevalent in our society; <sup>1</sup> and
13	Whomen there aims often another in the victime a complex account of denied alone with
14	Whereas, these sins often produce in the victims a complex response of denial along with immense fear and shame that persist with varying severity throughout life (e.g., 2
15 16	Samuel 13:1-22); and
17	Samuel 13.1-22), and
18	Whereas, it is the responsibility of the elders of the church to exercise their authority,
19	severally and jointly, to shepherd those who are under their care by guarding against
20	such sinful behavior as much as possible, by wisely caring for those victimized by the
21	sins of others, and by appropriately disciplining those guilty of such sins toward a full
22	repentance; and
23	
24 25	Whereas, these sins have been a concerning subject of attention not only in other denominations but even in the proceedings of the 46th General Assembly; and
26	Whomas the 12nd Canaral Assembly may joysly exhauted the DCA and its counts to resmand
27 28	Whereas, the 42nd General Assembly previously exhorted the PCA and its courts to respond boldly against one form of these sins, namely the sexual abuse of children; and
29 30	Whereas, no standardized resources for pastoral care on these sins and their complex
31	consequences exist for officers, church courts, and agencies in the PCA; and
32	consequences exist for officers, entiren courts, and agencies in the fert, and
33	Whereas, no clear guidelines for policy or practice with regard to these sins exist for the
34 35 36	officers, church courts, and agencies in the PCA that would protect individuals and congregations; and
37 38	Whereas, the Rules of Discipline make no consideration for the unique heinousness of these sins and their practical effect on victims;

1	Therefore, be it resolved that Missouri Presbytery hereby overtures the 47th General
2	Assembly of the PCA to form a committee to study:
3	
4	(1) the nature of domestic abuse and sexual assault;
5	(2) the pastoral resources available for the care of survivors of these sins;
6	(3) the best practices and policy guidelines for elders, church courts, and agencies for
7	protecting against these sins and for responding to them;
8	(4) the possibility of changes to the Rules of Discipline that would appropriately
9	protect victims of these sins within a biblical process; and
10	(5) the possible need for repentance as a church; and
11	
12	Be it further resolved that the committee shall be appointed by the moderator, and shall
13	include among its members or advisory members at least two subject-matter experts
14	and at least two women; and
15	
16	Be it further resolved that the budget for the study committee be set at \$15,000/year and that
17	funds be derived from gifts to the AC designated for that purpose, with Missouri
18	Presbytery committed to offer some money; and
19	
20	Be it further resolved that the committee shall present their findings and recommendations
21	for adoption by the 48th General Assembly.
