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6	Whereas, the Word of God indicates that all human beings are created in the image of God
7	(Genesis 1:26, 27) and consequently have great worth in God's sight, and
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9	Whereas, God's Word also indicates that human life is therefore of such value that to destroy
10	that life for any reason other than that which God has prescribed, which is murder, is
11	of such seriousness as to merit capital punishment (Genesis 9:5, 6), and
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13	Whereas, God has clearly indicated in His Word that murder is a sin against Him, according
14	to the moral law applicable to all times and circumstances, as codified in the tablets of
15	stone known as the Ten Commandments (Exodus 20:13; Deuteronomy 5:17), and
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17	Whereas, the Supreme Court decision known as Roe v. Wade, which struck down laws
18	prohibiting the practice of abortion of unborn children and legalized abortion in every
19	state in the United States of America, was predicated upon a fraudulent case involving
20	false testimony with respect to the circumstances surrounding it, which circumstances
21	thus wielded powerfully emotional and insidiously persuasive, yet mythical, import,

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24	Whereas, the fraudulent nature of the entire case was irrefutably verified by testimony
25	subsequent to the ruling by the plaintiff in the case, Norma McCorvey, the so-called

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38	Whereas, her obviously relevant and groundbreaking testimony has been largely ignored by
39	both the mainstream media and our culture at large, such that Roe v. Wade, as legal
40	opinion, is unjustifiably and ignorantly revered by many, and
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42	Whereas, the practice of abortion and its promotion have long been linked to the secular
43	humanistic ideology undergirding the practice of eugenics, which came to expression
44	in the death camps of Nazi Germany, and which was advocated in the writings of the

	Whereas, certain lawmakers within the United States government have persisted and now
10	again succeeded in forcing American taxpayers, against their desires and beliefs, in

12	multiple ways, to fund and undergird these wicked practices through government
13	subsidization of Planned Parenthood and other less prominent abortion providers, and
14 15	Whereas, medical science has advanced to the point of demonstrating, beyond a shadow of a
16	doubt, that the fetus within a mother's womb is a living organism, distinct from the
17	mother's body (possessing distinct DNA, etc.), and
18	mother's body (possessing distinct DIVA, etc.), and
19	Whereas, the notion that a living being changes into a different type of organism by passing
20	through a birth canal is untenable, both logically and scientifically, and

22	Whereas, God's Word refers to life in the womb as having personal and human existence
23	(e.g., Psalm 139:15, 16) and metes out capital punishment for causing the death of an

27	Whereas, the oft-cited cases of rape and incest do not justify the practice of abortion, since
28	the unborn child bears no responsibility for those sins and is the one who is punished
29	by losing his life through abortion, though innocent, which is a gross injustice and

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32	Whereas, there are no such things as "unwanted children," adoption agencies having waiting
33	lists of years consisting of couples who desperately want children and would gladly
34	take those who are being aborted, and

36	Whereas, the support services for pregnant women, including the unwed, are so prolific as to
37	render any woman contemplating an abortion utterly unjustified, if not dishonest, in
38	basing her decision on a lack of support or ability to raise the child, and
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40	Whereas, since Roe v. Wade, there have been more than 51 million murders of human beings
41	through abortion in the United States (an extremely conservative figure, according to
42	a comparison of information from the Centers for Disease Control and the Guttmacher

1	Institute), the overwhelming majority of which have been perpetrated in order to avoid
2	responsibility, undergird promiscuity, assert sinful autonomy, or for other depraved
3	purposes (based on information obtained through surveys by the Guttmacher
4	Institute), and
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6	Whereas, according to statistics available to the public, in the state of New York there are
7	now more abortions than live births, and
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9	Whereas, God's Word continually commands His people to do such as to "open your mouth
10	for the mute, for the rights of all who are destitute; open your mouth, judge righteously
11	defend the rights of the poor and needy" (Proverbs 31:8, 9), and is full of such
12	admonitions to speak for and defend those who cannot speak for or defend themselves

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15	Whereas, the foregoing demonstrates that the unborn are most certainly a quintessential
16	example of such a category of persons, and
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18	Whereas, the recent bill passed by the New York legislature and signed into law by its
19	governor effectively legalizes not only abortion up until the moment of birth, but also
20	infanticide after birth at the sole discretion of the mother, an act which was given a
21	standing ovation by those present, and
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23	Whereas, actions such as these are beyond ghastly and are indicated in Scripture to invite the
24	severe judgment of God upon societies and nations which permit such atrocities, and
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26	Whereas, our Confession of Faith indicates that it is proper and necessary for synods, "by
27	way of humble petition in cases extraordinary" (WCF 31:4) to address matters
28	which pertain to the civil magistrate, and
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30	Whereas, both the legalization of the murder of a helpless class, resulting in the loss of more
31	than 51 million lives, and the forced subsidization of such by individuals opposed to
32	it, constitute such an extraordinary case by any reasonable and honest definition, and
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34	Whereas, elders in the Church of the Lord Jesus Christ are shepherds and watchmen, giver
35	the responsibility to warn its people of the solemn judgment of God when their sir
36	demands such, and
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38	Whereas, the Scriptures declare that a failure to discharge this responsibility faithfully, as in
39	the case of the watchmen and shepherds of Israel, disposes those shepherds and
40	watchmen themselves to the awesome judgment of God (Isaiah 56:9-12; Ezekiel 33:1-
41	9; 34:1-10);
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43	Therefore, be it resolved that the Session of Christ the King Presbyterian Church, Norman
44	Oklahoma, hereby overture the 47 th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in

1 America and request that it officially, and on the basis of the inspired and authoritative Word of God, declare the following: 2 3 4 First, that all who participate in the practice of abortion, including mothers, for any reason other than to save the physical life of the mother, are guilty of complicity in 5 heinous sin, and subject to the severe judgment of God unless they repent and seek His 6 7 forgiveness, 8 Second, that all such above persons are not beyond the grace of God, and that 9 forgiveness and healing are abundantly available to such as will humble themselves in 10 godly sorrow leading to sincere repentance and submission to the revealed will of God 11 in Scripture, 12 13 Third, that sexual activity and pregnancy are inextricably linked according to the 14 design of God the Creator, rendering individuals engaged in intentional sexual activity 15 responsible for all of its results and consequences, and 16 17 Fourth, that a woman's body, in addition to being biologically distinct from an unborn 18 19 baby, is moreover not solely her own, to be regarded and utilized purely in accordance with her own autonomous discretion, but rather ultimately belongs to God the Creator, 20 and is to be utilized strictly in accordance with His revealed will, and 21 22 Fifth, that all professing Christians, especially those who labor in civil government, 23 are obligated to oppose the practice of abortion with all the vehemence befitting the 24 severity and urgency of the issue, 25 26 Sixth, that professing Christians who labor in civil government, who also advocate and 27 approve of the practice of abortion, should be disciplined to the limit of church censure 28 29 until and unless they repent of such wickedness, and 30 Seventh, that the civil authorities in the United States of America, at all levels, are 31 32 hereby warned that they are inviting the temporal and awesome judgment of God upon our nation in allowing this atrocity to continue, and that they are urged to repent and 33 exercise their God-given function of restraining evil by protecting the rights of all 34 people, especially the powerless, and including the unborn, and 35 36 Eighth, that the churches of the Presbyterian Church in America are urged to consider 37 the inclusion of ministries to abortion clinics and support of and cooperation with pro-38 life pregnancy resource agencies as part of their diaconal programs, and 39 40 Ninth, that the churches of the Presbyterian Church in America are urged to redouble 41 their efforts in biblical instruction on sex, sexuality, marriage, and family, and on 42 God's will concerning the interrelation of and participation in all of these. 43

Grounds:

1. The previous overtures and statements approved by the General Assembly, while salutary, do not speak explicitly and strongly enough to the biblical specifics surrounding the issue.

2. These previous overtures contain nothing affirming and declaring the responsibility of the Church to discipline those who are sinning in this area.

3. These previous overtures include little regarding the responsibility of Christian political leaders to oppose abortion, or regarding their sin in being complicit in approving or promoting it through various legislation, and their consequent liability to church discipline. Inasmuch as there are many professing Christians in the political arena who regard their political activity and commitments as unaccountable to church discipline and who thus feel confident in participating in the promotion of abortion on demand and its funding with no spiritual consequences, this needs to be addressed explicitly and officially by the Church, and such attention is long overdue.

4. The scientific, historical, and moral mythology surrounding abortion and its justification, including the deceptive and false context of the Roe V. Wade decision, and the nature and history of Planned Parenthood, needs to be officially and comprehensively addressed in the rationale for the Church's position. This has not been adequately accomplished in previous overtures, and is the reason for the extensive "Whereas" section of the proposed overture.

5. The secular humanistic culture concomitant with abortion on demand is becoming more brazen and aggressive daily. This requires a forceful, frank, and aggressive response from the Church. Abortion is an atrocity. Language which mollifies portrayal of the extreme evil of its nature, or which fails to speak accurately and honestly about the ramifications of its practice, is a dereliction of the duty of ministers of the Word and shepherds who are called to tell the sheep the truth, whatever consequences that might entail. To water down the truth in an effort to be "temperate" is in this context to unfaithful to our calling.

6. Sound and truly loving pastoral practice brings those who have sinned to an awareness of the heinousness of their sin, leading to godly sorrow which produces true repentance unto life. A too hasty application of comfort to those who have sinned in this way makes such a process impossible. Discretion and prudence are needed in the application of truth to individual cases, discerning where a person is in the process of repentance, but refraining from strong public statements and warnings regarding the practice of abortion does not well serve those who are grieving over their sin. Rather, true repentance joined with genuine faith in the justifying grace of Christ should render such individuals the strongest proponents of such language.
