Community Profile

Waynesboro is a city in Burke County, Georgia located 30-miles south of Augusta and 100-miles north of Savannah. The 2019 census reported that the population of Waynesboro was 5,363, and Burke County was 22,383. The racial makeup of the county was 48% White, 47% African-American, and 3.5% Hispanic or Latino. 24% of persons living in Burke County were reported to be living in poverty, and the median household income was \$44,151.

Burke County has seen an influx of transient workers employed in the construction of two additional reactors at Plant Vogtle Nuclear Power Plant. A drive through the east side of the county will reveal hundreds of campers and travel-trailers owned by construction workers.

Thanks to a healthy tax base boosted by the power plant, Burke County is able to invest millions of local dollars into education that other school systems cannot without burdening residents with higher taxes. The public schools are:
