

OUR VISION & MISSION



We seek to honor God and to strengthen our faith in Him as we seek to glorify our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We desire authentic faith and worship, to serve God, to share our faith in our community, and to grow in grace with the knowledge of Jesus. We strive to love and care for each other, bearing one another's burdens and lifting them up in prayer.

Grace Coastal Church, a member of the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA), is a gospel-driven, community-based church. We seek to share the gospel of Jesus Christ to Okatie and the surrounding neighborhoods where our members live, work, study, and play.

We are committed to serving God and seeking life transformation through:

- **Worship** To honor God with holy, accessible worship with a focus on the preaching of the word.
- **Prayer** To praise and adore God, to seek His will, and to lift one another up in constant prayer.
- Evangelism To love one another as a community of God's people, that Christ might be formed in us.
- Discipleship To bear witness to the good news of Jesus' resurrection both in word and deed.
- **Fellowship** To commune with and to serve one another across generations as believers in love, friendship, and service, as Christ dwells in each of us.

- Completion of strategic facilities plan to accommodate large sanctuary to accommodate one service, (vs. the existing 2 service split)

Worship

Prayer



Jesus encourages us to talk with our Heavenly Father in spirit and in truth. It is our privilege to communicate to God through prayer. Prayer is an essential element of our worship services, as we not only pray for God's redemptive work in our lives, but also for others in need of God's help.

Evangelism



From the beginning, the heart of the church's mission has been the proclamation of the good news of the kingdom of God through Jesus Christ. Through our faith we share the love of God, in deed, lifestyle, and word. Speak and they shall hear. It is a blessing to verbally explain the good news of the Bible to family, friends, and neighbors. This message takes precedence over any other service the church offers.

Discipleship



The church is responsible for developing and encouraging believers in Christ. In this we model Ephesians 4:11-12 and Colossians 1:28. We seek to train, to develop, and to mentor those who have trusted in Jesus. GCC encourages personal growth and discipline that will allow church members to reach out to others and form spiritual bonds.

Fellowship



The fellowship of the body of Christ, and the joy that goes with it, is how the gospel works in practice. Fellowship is essential for Christians because it links Christians together as they grow in Christ; without it, the church stagnates.



Grace Coastal Church was founded in 1998, originally known as Okatie Presbyterian.

The church property now sits on 13.09 acres and includes 1 additional building, hosting a membership of over 150 people. In addition, the church also accommodates Learning Together Lowcountry, a Christian homeschool group with over 200 children from 120 families.

Since its inception, Grace Coastal Church has been a member of the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA) and is part of the Lowcountry Presbytery, which includes churches from Summerville to Charleston to Hilton Head.

In its almost 25 year existence, Grace Coastal Church has been blessed to have been served by only 3 senior pastors:

The Rev. Al Lutz, 1998-2004

The founding pastor, served from 1998 to 2004. Pastor Lutz had a degree in horticulture from the University of Kentucky and developed a strong following of Marines from the Beaufort Marine Corps Air Station and the Marine Corps Recruit Depot at Parris Island.

The Rev. Bob Bates, 2004-2011

Pastor Bob graduated from the Citadel and had a natural way of presenting God's Word. The church grew and flourished under his leadership.

The Rev. Sam Joyner, 2012-2021

Pastor Sam was a undergraduate of Furman University and graduate from Covenant Seminary in St. Louis. Sam enjoyed leading Grace Coastal Church and delighted in mercy ministries within the community.

INTERIM PASTOR

WORSHIP & MUSIC

WORSHIP AT GRACE COASTAL

We practice an elder-led, informal-liturgical worship style, influenced by historic reformed liturgical structures. As people from varied backgrounds brought together in Christ, this includes traditional worship elements like responsive readings, recited prayers, and newer instrumentation and musical styles. Both styles are included in order to bring together the formal and traditional with the informal and modern.

Great effort is taken to curate worship music that is true, accurate, applicable to life, and singable by the congregation. The music of the church is part of the worship offering of the congregation to the living God, and must therefore be accessible by congregants, while prioritizing robust theology and biblical concepts.

The worship is gospel-focused and designed to follow the story of redemption, including aspects of each major section of that story: the initiating call of God, the praise in the garden, acknowledging the effects of the fall in confession, celebrating the joy of redemption and restoration in Christ, pointing in word and sacrament to the eternal kingdom of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and a sending with God's blessing as we work in hope of that coming kingdom.

We are currently holding two services at 8:30 and 11:00 am, with well-attended Adult and Children's Education classes held between the services. We also livestream the 8:30 AM Sunday service to our website, Facebook, and YouTube. Audio versions of each sermon are also made available as podcasts distributed to services such as iTunes and Spotify. GCC also continues to expand and enhance its digital ministry activities, including through mobile platforms and member collaboration tools.



ABOUT OKATIE & SURROUNDING AREA

WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT GCC & THE OKATIE AREA

Combined attendees for our two Sunday services about 125. Approximately 50 percent of our congregation is retired, 40 percent working and 10 percent students.

Grace Coastal Church is a community active church with its facilities being used by the following organizations: Cub Scouts, Beaufort Alliance, Sun City Bible Study, Learning Together Lowcountry, Beaufort Review Board, AL-Anon, and AA.

Within just a few miles of GCC there are four residential communities with over one thousand residences, Sun City being the largest, and six more with just under a thousand rooftops. Most of these communities have been developed within the last twenty-five years.

Okatie is located south of Beaufort and north of Bluffton, SC. Bluffton's population is about 33,000 with the median age being 35.1 years. Male/female ratio is nine males for every ten females, with 62% being married. Families with children under 18 years of age is 51%. The percentage of those speaking English is 83%, with 12% speaking Spanish.

Real estate prices for single family homes range from \$413,000 in Sun City, \$420,000 in Cypress Ridge, to \$365,000 in Margaritaville.

The Bluffton Campus of the University of South Carolina Beaufort is just four miles southwest of GCC. Also nearby is the Technical College of the Low Country (TCL). Bluffton and the surrounding area has eight public elementary schools, two public middle schools, two public high schools, four private schools, and a number of home school groups, including LTL. The schools allow for multiple options for children to participate, and are well placed in the area for accessibility.
