Where We Are

RPC is located in the heart of downtown Ephrata, Pennsylvania.

Ephrata Borough is a small town surrounded by suburban developments and farmland in northern Lancaster County, PA. It is centrally located to several cities and attractions: downtown Lancaster (30 min.), Reading (30 min.), Hershey (45 min.), Harrisburg (50 min.), Philadelphia (90 min.), Baltimore (90 min.) and Washington D.C. (2.5 hours).



Ephrata is proud of its history and heritage. It is named after the biblical town Ephrathah and is sister city to Eberbach, Germany, the origin of its founder, Conrad Beissel. Ephrata was established in 1732 as a religious community, known locally as the Ephrata Cloister, and was well known for its calligraphic *Frakturschriften* art, music, and printing works. As the cloister community declined in the early 19th century,

the town itself grew to become a regional center of commerce. The openings of the Mountain Springs Resort and the Mount Vernon House, as well as its fame as a key stop along the Reading & Columbia Railroad further fueled the town's development. Ephrata became an incorporated borough in 1891.

In recent years, Ephrata has established itself as a thriving community, cultural hub, and tourist destination. It is home to a lively downtown plaza, the largest street fair in Pennsylvania, a beautiful rail trail, several parks and recreational areas, and an abundance of family-owned eateries and businesses.





Our Story



Reformed Presbyterian Church was founded on March 8, 1982, when a small group of members from Westminster Presbyterian Church (Lancaster, PA) met in the living room of a home in Ephrata. Within a few short years, that group grew into a church of 65 members, called Rev. Stephen Beck as their organizing pastor, and acquired the former Pioneer Fire Company building as their new home. RPC became a particularized church in the Susquehanna Valley Presbytery of the Presbyterian Church in America on May 20, 1984.

In 1993, Rev. Tom Nicholas was installed as RPC's Senior Pastor. A large-scale renovation took place in 2000 to add a sanctuary, Sunday school rooms, and additional office space. Rev. Kevin Sheahan was hired as Assistant Pastor in January 2018 and was elected to the Associate Pastor position in 2020. Since Tom's retirement in June 2022, Kevin has been fulfilling pastoral duties while RPC seeks a solo pastor.

Over the years our ministry focus has evolved as the needs of our congregation and community have changed. We have a rich history of supporting and sending out missionaries, many of whom are "homegrown", to such places as England, Germany, South Asia, Taiwan, and Niger, among others. Supporting individuals and families touched by disability and ministering to their unique and specific needs have always been a hallmark of our church. We strive to be the hands and feet of Jesus within the Ephrata community through mercy ministry, outreach, and the occasional new endeavor. For example, we are currently piloting an English as a Second Language (ESL) program focused on reaching our non-English-speaking neighbors. This program is set to launch in Fall 2022.

Our congregation is blessed to be a family that spans a wide age range and multiple generations. We seek to train up our covenant children through our Children's Worship, Sunday school, Youth Group, and summer Kingdom Kids programs. We also prioritize adult Christian education through various means such as (but not limited to) Bible study, CAFE and elective Sunday school classes, and small groups. Because building relationships and loving one another well is important to us, we also host multiple corporate fellowship events scheduled throughout the year. Pastoral and Ministry Leadership

- Knows who he is in Christ and is faithful in studying and preaching the Word of God boldly with urgency and conviction, bringing to bear on the changing needs of individuals, the local community, and the broader world.
- Is competent in communication and organizational leadership.
- Is experienced with casting a vision for the church, mentoring the staff and working with the Session to support programs for all age groups.
- Accepts administrative responsibilities in a climate of delegated tasks, shared leadership with the Session, and is a willing agent of change.
- Expresses eagerness to know, love, and shepherd the flock with Christ-like compassion and empathy.
- Desires to teach the word of God to all, working with the Session to develop educational needs and goals to support the overall mission of the church.

Position Requirements:

- Has a thorough knowledge of Scripture and experience as an excellent preacher of the Word of God.
- Has obtained a Master of divinity degree, or equivalent, with pastoral ministry experience.
- Holds ordination in the Presbyterian Church in America or is eligible to transfer into the PCA.
- Is a wise and humble leader with a minimum of 4 years of pastoral experiences.
- Exhibits competency in communication and organizational leadership.

Theological Requirements:

- Affirms the inerrancy of the Bible as supreme authority with a commitment to reformed and covenantal theology.
- Endorses the Westminster Confession of Faith.
- Understands church history and is interested in and understands current theological issues.

Personal Traits and Skills (not listed in order of priority):

- Is a believer in Jesus Christ with the desire to see the name of Jesus exalted by the advancement of God's kingdom through evangelism and missions.
- Is a man of humility, integrity, and self-discipline.
- Is a man with a servant's heart who is engaging, loving, hospitable, personable, and approachable.
- Is a family man who enjoys the support of his wife as his helpmate at home and in ministry.
