Our congregation is seeking a senior pastor to minister in the following ways:

Preaching & Teaching. We seek a gifted expository preacher who is rooted in Reformed theology and communicates scriptural truth with confidence and clarity. The congregation will be both challenged and equipped to cultivate growth in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ.

Worship. We desire a pastor who will lead the congregation with biblical worship by the use of the ordinary means of grace. Our ideal candidate will meticulously plan worship services for the spiritual formation of both adults and children. This will involve integrating music, creeds, scripture, and the sacraments in a cohesive manner that reverently honors our Reformed tradition.

Spiritual Care. Developing spiritually mature members involves walking alongside them during both joyous moments and life's trials, all while pointing them toward their only source of hope, which is Christ. This includes providing a clear understanding of the philosophical and theological foundations of current issues.

Leadership. Committed to working collaboratively with the Session in leading the staff and congregation with humility and grace. A proven ability to clearly define roles, delegate tasks, and provide oversight to staff.

In 1985, Westkirk held its first worship service, and by God's grace, 30 years later, our congregation continues to grow both spiritually and as a covenantal family. Reformed Theology. Along with our commitment to the Bible, we also adhere to the Westminster Standards, embracing our rich Reformed Protestant tradition. "*Semper reformanda*," the Latin phrase meaning "always reforming," has characterized Westkirk over our 30-year history.

Gracious & Hospitable. We strive to be a gracious and welcoming community. Our membership includes individuals who come from broadly evangelical churches, as well as from different reformed traditions.

Multigenerational. While much of our recent growth has come from young families with small children, we still have a strong and active older adult contingent.

Vision for the Future. We continue to see new families and individuals join our congregation. As a thriving congregation, we look forward to seeing what the Lord will do in the future. Church planting is an exciting opportunity, and we are open to God's will if He leads us in that direction.

Worship. Our worship service follows a set liturgy that emphasizes our belief that God is the One who initiates, and we are the ones who respond. God calls us to worship Him, and we respond in praise and confession of our sins. God forgives us and declares us righteous, and we respond in thankful offerings of our lives and resources. God gives us sacraments, and we receive them with gratitude. God nourishes us with his Word, and we respond in joyful song. Women's Ministry. *(Led by Discipleship Committee)*

Demographic

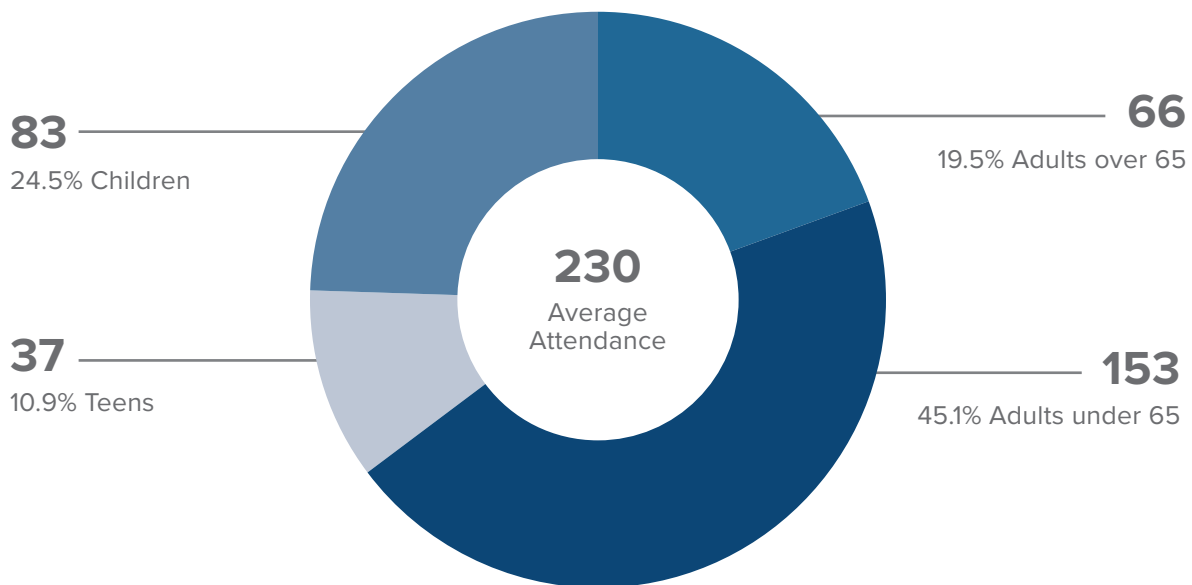
Des Moines, Suburbs, & beyond!

A high percentage of our congregation lives in the western suburbs of Des Moines, but we do have families that come from more than 30 miles away.

Finances. Over the past two decades, the Lord has abundantly provided for Westkirk's financial needs, and we are extremely thankful for His many blessings. This provision has enabled us to remain debt-free, with the exception of our mortgage. We have never found it necessary to raise additional funds to meet our budget.

The History of Westkirk.

Where we have been and where the Lord is taking us.

In 1985, 50 Christians seeking a new way to honor the Father in worship and hungering for a better understanding of the Word of God met. As they shared their ideas and dreams, an infant church was born!

In 1987, Westkirk became a member of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church (EPC).

In 2002, the congregation voted to disconnect from the EPC and return to an independent Presbyterian status. Throughout this transition, Westkirk continued its founding principles of Reformed Theology.

In 2004, Michael Mudlaff was called, ordained, and installed as Pastor and Head of Staff at Westkirk Presbyterian Church.

In 2021, The congregation of Westkirk voted to affiliate with the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA).

In 2023, Pastor Michael announced his succession from the role of Senior Pastor and his move into global missions, equipping international ministers full-time.

The Lord has been faithful to Westkirk for nearly forty years. We are grateful for Pastor Michael's shepherding of Westkirk. We are excited to watch the Lord work as He provides our next pastor to shepherd us into this new season. As a congregation, we are corporately praying each Sunday for the man God will ultimately call to Westkirk.

JOB DESCRIPTION

The senior Pastor is responsible for leading and carrying out the vision of Westkirk Presbyterian Church (WPC), working closely with the church Session to provide spiritual leadership and oversight for the congregation and her members, and demonstrating a genuine zeal for the Truth of Scripture through his preaching and teaching, discipleship, shepherding, and outreach endeavors.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. **Preaching and Teaching:** The Senior Pastor will strive to engender an attitude of worship in the congregation in all that we do, both corporately and individually.
 - Prayerfully oversees the preparation of worship and leads as minister of Word and Sacrament in public worship. Preaching is to be Gospel-centered, exegetical, and expositional, utilizing timely and relevant illustrations, and providing clear applications of biblical truth. Sermon content should be both challenging and comforting to the congregation.
 - Teaches and disciples the eternal truths of God's Word, equips the saints as ambassadors to testify to our faith, to do what is good, and to advance the Kingdom of God and follow the Great Commission.
 - Ensures that covenant children are catechized and prepared for communicant membership. Frequently leads adult Christian education classes and other educational programs of WPC.
2. **Discipleship:** The Senior Pastor will play a key role in the ongoing development and implementation of WPC's discipling efforts.
 - Oversees WPC's ministries and helps church members develop their gifts of service.
 - Provides oversight of leadership training and development for congregational leaders.
 - Leads and encourages WPC to be more intentional and engaged in each other's lives.
 - Ensures that WPC is effectively implementing its stated vision of *To Know Christ and to Make Him Known*.
3. **Shepherding:** The Senior Pastor will personally invest in the spiritual lives of the congregation.
 - Prays with and for the congregation members.
 - Visits church members, especially the sick; counsels the troubled and seeks out the wayward.
 - Conducts pre-marital counseling, officiates at weddings and funerals.

- Exhorts church membership in the area of giving, stressing stewardship (time, talent, and treasure) and promoting a general awareness of church finances.
- 4. Outreach:** The Senior Pastor will maintain and further develop WPC's emphasis on evangelism and mission outreach.
- Encourage a culture of actively reaching out to those who do not know the Lord; leading by example.
 - Oversee formal and informal programs in evangelism.
 - Support the congregation's involvement in global missions.
- 5. Administration:** WPC seeks a culture of mutual support, accountability and cooperation among its leadership and staff.
- Shares the administrative responsibility of WPC with the Session; participates fully as a member of the Iowa Presbytery, supporting its meetings, duties, and ministry. Maintains a regular church office schedule agreeable to the Session.
 - Serves as Moderator of the Session, possesses a clear understanding of his authority and role in relation to the Session and the Diaconate.
 - Provides day to day oversight for WPC's Associate Pastors and staff; responsible for mentoring and developing the talents of each of these individuals.

ATTRIBUTES, SKILLS, AND QUALIFICATIONS:

- An ordained (or ordainable) minister in the PCA with a Master of Divinity from a seminary approved by the Session.
- Understands and is willing to adhere to the PCA Book of Church Order.
- Has at least five (5) years of full-time ministerial experience in at least one church.
- Has proven to be faithful to God in his personal and family life, exemplifying order, stability, self-discipline, and gentility. Watches his life and doctrine closely and will be an example of the Gospel.
- Possesses and provides strong leadership and demonstrated relational skills to be able to engage staff and congregants of all ages.

COMPENSATION:

The Senior Pastor's compensation package includes salary, housing allowance, benefits, ministerial expense reimbursement, and paid time off. The total amount of the compensation package will be negotiable, and consideration will be given to the cost of living in Des Moines and surrounding communities.
