
The Call

Our History

Bedford Presbyterian Church was planted in 1976 as Grace Reformed Presbyterian Church. In 1982 it joined the Presbyterian Church in America. After meeting for a number of years in rented spaces in central Halifax, in 1989 the congregation moved within Halifax to the residential community of Bedford and changed their name to Bedford Presbyterian Church.

This move enabled the church to become a closer, more identifiable part of a community, to purchase land and to build a permanent church home. In December 1991, Bedford Presbyterian Church held its first service in its new (and present) home at 49 Nelsons Landing Boulevard.



Our City

Nova Scotia is a unique and remarkably beautiful place to put down roots. With over 13,000 km of coastline and a multitude of parks and sports facilities, it offers an abundance of recreational opportunities. Halifax's population is 530,000 strong and growing daily with people moving to this area from other parts of Canada and from countries around the world. Halifax is rich in educational choices with four universities and public/private/Christian schools. The city is home to the IWK Children's Hospital and the QEII Health Sciences Centre. Both institutions are teaching and research hospitals providing tertiary care to Atlantic Canada.

There is something for everyone locally from skating outside on the Halifax Oval to exploring the museum at Citadel Hill National Historic Site or attending an outdoor concert on the Halifax Commons. There are professional soccer, hockey and lacrosse teams for sports enthusiasts. Halifax Metro has a splendid landscape with many beaches, parks, lakes and hiking trails.

Nova Scotia has a rich cultural heritage derived from the variety of people who call this land home. Halifax is the centre of a vibrant East Coast Music scene as well as a variety of top-notch cultural institutions such as art galleries, Symphony Nova Scotia, Neptune Theatre, the Dalhousie Arts Centre, the Halifax Jazz Festival and numerous smaller venues and festivals for taking in a play or musical performance.

Halifax is visited by more than 200 cruise ships each season, drawn here by its vibrant waterfront and the many historical, cultural and recreational attractions.

Bedford is just a 15-minute drive from the Halifax waterfront and 20 minutes from Halifax Stanfield International Airport, a regional hub with direct flights to Canadian, European and U.S. cities.

Halifax is a major shipping port serving over 250 destinations. It is the shopping, financial, business and research hub of the Atlantic Provinces. Home to Maritime Forces Atlantic of the Royal Canadian Navy, there is a significant military presence. Nova Scotia is overflowing with history, be it tragic (Halifax Explosion of 1917) or triumphant (the Schooner Bluenose on the Canadian dime). It is a fascinating province to explore.
