We are a loving country (holler) congregation in Wild, Wonderful West Virginia. Our little church sits between two mountains, three miles up Winifrede Hollow. Some people may feel claustrophobic living between two mountains, but for those of us who live here or grew up here, it feels like we are nestled in the arms of God. There is a sense of community and closeness that brings peace. Currently, we have approximately 40 active members. We want to not just increase in number, we want to touch lives in our community and to be used by God to bring people to know Jesus. There are many unchurched people in the immediate and surrounding communities. We need a leader who can help equip us to reach out to the surrounding community with the gospel. We are looking for a minister to teach us and feed us God's word and to lead us in fulfilling the Great Commission.

Over the last 40 years, the men of our congregation have built the church, the gym/activity building, a manse, and a shelter where we can have Sunday School picnics, Vacation Bible School, etc. The church has a simple but beautiful sanctuary that can seat about 175 people. We have an activity building with a large kitchen, a nursery, and storage rooms. The building is used for fellowship meals, wedding receptions, parties, youth activities – basketball and volleyball games, etc. We also have a covered picnic shelter for church picnics and activities. The manse has 3 bedrooms upstairs with a living room, dining room, kitchen and bathroom. There is a full basement with 4 rooms that could be 2 more bedrooms, a family room and an office plus a bathroom and a laundry room. There is a covered back porch and a large back yard with a play gym that has recently been added.

We have Sunday School at 10:00 followed by worship service at 11:00. There is a nursery and Junior Church provided during the worship service. On Wednesdays, we have prayer and Bible study for the adults and youth group for the children. One goal is to grow our young families and our youth

and our youth group. On the third Tuesday of every month, our ladies WIC group meets for a Bible lesson and to conduct the financial business of the group and to plan church events. We have several talented people in the congregation who work with the youth, teach Sunday School and Vacation Bible School. We also have an active music program with several guitar players helping to lead and assist the pianist during worship service.

Over the last four years, we have had a retired teaching elder from New River Presbytery as our stated pulpit supply; however, we are looking and praying for the man God has chosen to be our full-time pastor.

Community Information

Winifrede is located approximately 15 miles from the capital city of Charleston, and approximately 9 miles from Kanawha City. Both have shopping centers, restaurants, and medical/dental/orthodontic facilities. There are also grocery stores, pharmacies, restaurants, and a Walmart within the communities surrounding Winifrede. There are three hospitals located in Charleston. This includes CAMC Memorial, CAMC General, and CAMC Women and Children's.

Winifrede is located in Kanawha County. The area public schools are listed below. Several private schools in the area include Bible Center, Mountaineer Montessori School, Elk Valley Christian School, and Cross Lanes Christian School. Kanawha County also offers a virtual school option, which allows students to access their courses online. While online, they are still allowed to participate in all school activities, compete athletically, and attend their high school graduation.
