

Job Type: Part-time (20 hours/week)

Job Description: The Children's Discipleship Coordinator is to come alongside parents by overseeing the care of our children, ages infant through fifth grade. This includes oversight of curriculum, building usage, teachers, and volunteers. This individual will be supervised by and accountable to the Associate Pastor. They will work alongside other staff and leaders to help implement City Church's vision and actively participate in the life of City Church. If not a member of City Church currently, the candidate must become a member to fulfill the job.

Intro to City Church: We are a community of <u>250</u> members & roughly <u>280</u> regular attendees, serving roughly <u>80</u> children infant-5th grade, with a team of <u>70</u> volunteers. City Church worships on Sunday mornings at Foster Seventh Day Adventist Church.

Supervision: Reports directly to the Associate Pastor; the elder board (Session) has final oversight.

Compensation: \$24,600 annually.

Personal Qualifications:

- A vibrant Christian faith, commitment to the gospel of grace, and a desire to serve God through the discipleship of children and families
- A love of children that imitates that of Christ
- A familiarity with Reformed and Presbyterian doctrine and theology
- A good work-life balance
- Experience recruiting and managing volunteers

Ministry Responsibilities:

- 1. Weekly
 - Email reminders to volunteers lesson plans/volunteer assignments
 - Write lesson plans or tailors the curriculum
 - Prep curriculum boxes
 - Sunday morning setup arrive by 8:45 to set up classrooms
 - Sunday morning teardown stay after service to ensure classes are returned to working order for the teachers at Foster SDA Church
 - Communicate with Foster staff about classroom issues as needed.
 - Connect with new families on Sunday morning—help with check-in, introduce them to classes and teachers.
- 2. Monthly
 - Add new volunteers after new members join (from ministry interest surveys)
 - Introduce our programs to new volunteers
 - Coordinate monthly events for New City Catechism
 - Buy supplies for classes.
 - Schedule volunteers using Planning Center Services

3. Quarterly

- Coordinate the communicant membership process with the Session.
- Interview new communicants with an Elder.
- Buy and give gifts for baptisms and new communicant members.
- Conduct safety training for new volunteers
