Each intern will receive a stipend, ministry budget, and free housing (should they need it). The internship is a full-time commitment; having an additional job or taking summer classes will not be possible.

General Responsibilities

- Weekly worship attendance
- Relational, energetic, hardworking, and creative

Main Responsibilities

- Regular teaching of Sunday school
- Semi-regular teaching at youth group
- Preparing and leading youth group
- Preparation of camps, retreats, and trips

Care Responsibilities: (20+ hrs.)

Meeting with and discipling students is of primary focus

- One-on-ones, group hangouts, connecting with fringe students
- Weekly staff meetings

Administrative Responsibilities (20+ hrs.)

- Preparing publications and mailings, food, communication, recruiting, transportation, etc.
- Weekly readings
- Other duties as assigned
